Here are some guidelines as to what we are looking for when considering submissions for publication:

- Preferred image size 8 x 12 inches @ 300DPI (approx. 9mg); Minimum size 4 x 6 inches @ 300DPI (approx. 2.5mg)
- Images from websites CANNOT be accepted.
- Please send RGB files: We will convert to CMYK using our own color profiles designed for the best magazine reproduction.
- No watermarks or photo credits in images
- Special note to bakers, caterers, and florists please take the background of your image into consideration. Set up a nice backdrop and tabletop.
- Please include your company name in file names
- NOTE: You MUST have releases for all the images you submit.

If you are part of an unusual, unique or other inspirational wedding, please gather those images as one submission for our Real Weddings sections.

For Styled Shoot submissions, all vendors involved MUST be clients of Texas Wedding Guide unless preapproved by Texas Wedding Guide editorial staff.

To Submit:

- Place all of images into one folder; then compress (stuff, zip) folder
- After compression upload photos at http://www.uppercasedesigngroup.com/upload-a-file
- Max file size of that compressed folder should be 1gb or less. If necessary, separate upload into to multiple uploads.
- DO NOT embed or attach individual images or slide shows.

Please note we do have a strict exclusivity policy and **cannot** share work that has been featured on another blog or in another publication for consideration for Real Weddings or Styled Shoots. If you think your submission is perfect for a featured spot, we recommend you do not even share it on your own blog before sending it to us.
